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| Go back to seeing books at parents evening (1) | We chose an early Autumn parents evening so parents and staff could discuss settling into their new year/ class in a timely manner, earlier in the term. All books will be available in Spring parents evening and this is early in Spring and shared with targets for future progress Parents are welcome to come into class and share their child's learning at any time, however, I will review this before next Autumn. |
| Engage with parents more regularly about continuous improvement (1) | Agreed. I would like to be able to share our strategic plans and enable parents to feed into those plans. Previously in school we have invited parents to attend parent forum meetings - face to face and online and used google forms to gather views. I will be looking at how best to do this to gather the widest views in phase 2 of our communication strategy. |
| Supporting parents in how we teach so parents can support their child at home (3) | Workshops for parents planned and will be shared in the area of how we teach maths - fluency and reasoning, reading and writing. We are always happy to help individuals where required too- please ask. Would like to provide opportunities for parents of children with special educational needs to see our provision and strengthen links between home and school. |
| | In addition, to support understanding of neurodivergent children - already started by inviting parents to attend staff meetings with specialists on girls with autism. To extend to dyslexia and ADHD. |
| Less wordy newsletter (2) | New opportunities with school spider app means that I can send 'general' info as a message as they come to light eg holidays clubs and keep the newsletter for more important info. Already listened to parents requests in having dates available at the start and including this half term and the start of the next so they have advance dates. Will look at possible options for sharing good news and reducing words in it. |
| Opportunities for children to feedback (1 | We currently do 2 pupil questionnaires every year. One in autumn linked to wellbeing and general overview of learning and another in Spring to discuss attitudes to learning and progress. In addition, through our PHSE sessions, and in fact most days, children can discuss what has gone well, not well and offer suggestions. Through our pupil voice groups, children can also influence and impact change in school. I would encourage any child to engage in school discussions or pupil voice groups. I do feel we have an extremely open door for children suggestion and feedback and would be happy to take direct feedback on any child's different experience |

| Better communication if child injured at school (1) | Will review our process to ensure robust. Regular updates with staff are planned in and delivered. We aim to get it right every time but if we fall short of this, we do apologise and learn from it. |
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| More individual feedback for child's progress (1) | Parents are always welcome to make an appointment to receive feedback on progress mid-term. |
| Learning journey (1) | Class teachers have added an overview of the term's learning on the class pages each term so that parents can share and extend children's learning of the whole curriculum. These are added each term by the end of the first week back. We will send these via school spider to parents of children in each class. If any parents need further information, please don't hesitate to ask. |
| Larger lunch portions | We appreciate we cannot always get it right with lunches but through our regular cook, Tracey, children get a good offer of 3 main courses and a wide variety of deserts. This is always under review and evaluation by school leadership who are in the school hall and we will continue to monitor this. Any individual concerns, please feel free to raise them with your child's teacher or the school office. |
| More trips to galleries (1) | We are passionate about the arts and seek to offer a balance of visitors and trips. We track our trips to curriculum areas to ensure they add educational value and whilst recently we have accessed the Liverpool Philharmonic, Manchester Theatres, Museums we will look at how we can continue to improve this. We try and ensure that we represent the whole subject curriculum with our trips and enrichments and art and design and history are part of our curriculum offer. |
| Dispute resolution improvement(1) | We employ a restorative approach to incidents and work hard on consistency in supporting pupils in conflict resolution. Staff follow the same process in listening and facilitating resolutions. In addition, our peer mediators are trained to support children on a low level basis where they can help. Will review the effectiveness and impact of this to ensure we are getting this right. I will share more often the different aspects of our behaviour policy with parents as working together in partnership teaching and modelling excellent behaviour is a priority. |
| School seeks my views on the education it offers | Phase 2 of the communication policy this year is looking at ways in which I can hare our curriculum offer and Christian distinctiveness with parents more and seek their views to assist in school development. In previous year's we have held parent forums in person and on zoom. I am very keen to do this as we embed our curriculum further. |
